SCHOLARSHIPS, MINI CAMPS and DANCE INTENSIVE



Durham Arts Council awards scholarships on the basis of financial need. Scholarships are awarded through a formal application process, and DAC offers scholarships to children and teens for up to 75% of the cost of the camp. The awards are made based upon the financial need of the child/teen's family. A scholarship application should be completed and attached to the camp registration form. CULTURAL ARTS CAMPS

Your camper will take a journey across the globe during Cultural Camp. Each one or two-week session is a fun and in-depth exploration of the arts and culture of a country. Depending on age and interest, student will choose a performing or visual arts track. Each session culminates in camp exhibition and performance on the last Friday at 1:30pm.

Cultural Camps run from **9:00 AM – 3:00 PM** with early drop off beginning at 8:00 AM. DAC provides a fresh fruit snack. If your camper has food allergies to fruit, please pack a snack. Please pack your campers a brown bag lunch (no refrigerator or microwave available).

Need full day? Add the Afternoon Adventures program from 3:00 PM – 5:30 PM

Afternoon Adventures complement activities campers have worked on during the day, and includes visits by extra special artists and performers as well as fieldtrips to fun cultural destinations.

For Cultural Camps, choose your arts track based on the campers age and interest.

Age 5 & 6: Creative Kids - For Rising K and 6 year olds, this camp offers storytelling, dance, music and fun age appropriate art activities for our youngest campers.

For ages 7-13 - Choose between visual or performing arts track.

Session A: Glorious Ghana

Once known as the Gold Coast for its abundance of gold Ghana, which lies in on the Southern coast of West Africa, became independent in 1957. People have lived in the area now known as Ghana since the Bronze Age, making its culture extremely diverse and rich in indigenous influence. Specialized crafts can be found throughout Ghana most famously Adinkra printing and Kente Cloth.

Session B: Captivating Canary Islands

The Canary Islands, located off the northwestern coast of Africa, have one of the most diverse natural landscapes in the world. Traversing this “mini continent” will take you through thick forests, over lush green plains, across scorched desert, up volcanoes and along beautiful sandy beaches, all with their own unique ecosystems. Thick strokes of African and Latin flair mix with heavy Spanish influences creating a colorful and captivating scene of art, music, food and culture.

Chile is a long, narrow strip of land bracketed by the Andes Mountains to the East and the Pacific Ocean to the West isolating it from its neighbors. Most of its population is concentrated in the central part of the country, Indigenous cultures can still be found in the north and the south including the Aymara¹ Indians and the Mapuche Indians. After 30 years of political turmoil Chile is now one of South America's most stable and prosperous nations, making it a bright and cheerful place to be!

DAC SUMMER ARTS CAMP 2017

TEEN INTENSIVES AND CAREER CONNECTIONS

Each 1 week intensive is designed for middle/high school teens (ages 13-17, unless otherwise noted) that have some experience with art and want to learn more about a media in depth. Each class focuses on a particular artistic area, allowing for teens to develop works that can be included in their portfolio and explore career opportunities related to each artistic area by meeting local artists and professionals. All classes take place at the Durham Arts Council. Each 1 week intensive is \$110. If you bundle a morning and afternoon intensive for a full day the cost is \$200.

Digital Media Production

In this course we will explore the conception and creation of short-form digital media. Topics will cover production and editing of short videos using Premiere Pro and creating social graphics with the new Adobe Spark. We will learn how to successfully design interactive and engaging web-stories to view on phones, tablets, and across the internet. Class activities include dedicated interaction with instructor as well as peer-to-peer creative collaboration. Students will need to bring their own digital cameras (or can potentially use camera phones as needed) and a USB stick or portable hard drive for media backup and use between personal devices and classroom computers.

Anime -Manga Sketching - License to Draw Everything

Take a cue from Anime and Manga artists to design and sketch your own illustrated book or comic book in the theme of your choice. Game Design Basics

Do you have ideas on how to improve the games you enjoy playing and want to learn the basics of game design? Explore artistic tools while you learn the basic design techniques used by professional designers. You will learn with some basic Photoshop skills for creating sprites and a better understanding of design basics while using GameMaker to create some games of your own.

Digital Photo

In this class, students will learn how to use their own digital cameras to create images that are visually compelling and personally meaningful. They will learn the technical basics of operating their cameras as well as studying the visual elements of a photograph and how to create an image that grabs the viewer's eye. This class will give students the opportunity to work hands-on with an instructor as well as benefit from peer support. Students will need to bring their own digital camera and a data stick or portable hard drive, as well as let the instructor know ahead of time what kind of camera they are bringing. DSLR cameras are preferred if possible, but we will work with whatever camera you are able to bring!

Modern Weaving

In this intensive you will learn the fundamentals of loom weaving using frame looms, circular looms, and non-traditional looms. Through multiple weaving projects students will learn basic stitches and decorative elements, color design and harmony, as well as experiment with different fibers and texture.

Ink, Fire, Irons and Hot Wax: A Week of Encaustic Art

Explore adventurous art-making with hot wax, fire and irons! Encaustic is an ancient African painting technique utilizing a unique wax-based medium. In this class we will use encaustic to create amazing collages on professional wooden panels. We'll start by illustrating original or pre-made drawings using Sharpies and other inks, then we'll use hot wax and collaging tools to seal them onto the panels. Our fusing tools will include safety-rated butane and propane torches, hot irons, heat guns and torch lighters. Safety comes first in this class! In addition to learning about encaustic techniques, drawing, color and composition, you will learn safety procedures, ventilation and proper care for art pieces and tools.

Drawing

Do you love draw to draw? Are you ready to take your skills to the next level? This class will allow you to focus on creating portfolio quality artwork through the medium of drawing. This class will teach you how to use your sketchbook as a tool for developing and refining your work, as well as provide an understanding of drawing concepts such as elements of composition, light, shadow, value, and experimental modes of drawing using varied mark making.

SUMMER, INTERSESSION AND TEACHER WORKDAY ARTS CAMP REFUND POLICY: Parents who need to withdraw their child/children from any Summer or Intersession Arts Camp, for any reason should contact DAC Education Office in writing at least *2 weeks before* session begins. You will receive a refund, less \$30 service charge per two-week camp per session per participant and \$15 service charge per mini-camp session per participant. These are the only circumstances in which DAC gives refunds. DAC will transfer your child to a later session only if space is available. Parents who need to withdraw their child/children from any Summer or Intersession Arts Camp, for any reason, less than two weeks prior to the start date or after camp has begun should contact DAC Education Office in writing. You will not receive a refund. You may transfer your remaining balance to another camp or course in the same term for any family member. DAC will transfer your child to a later session only if space is available. Mail-in Registrations will be recorded by date of receipt. *You may mail-in, drop-off or fax (919)560.2725 registrations. For more information please call (919)560.2726.*

CAMP LATE POLICY: Participants that are picked up after the closing time of camp will be charged a late fee. The fee is as follows: For participants who are registered until 3pm, a \$5 fee will be charged per family if participant(s) have not been picked up by 3:15pm, a \$17 fee will be charged per participant who remains after 3:30pm since the camper will at that point be participating in the Afternoon Adventures program, by default. For participants who are registered until 5:30pm, once the parent/guardian is up to 15 minutes late a \$5 fee will be charged per family. Payment is due at the time of late pick-up.
