Drawing/Painting

Basic Drawing (Ages 15 & up)

Drawing is a way of seeing and communicating. Develop your own personal eye and language as you discover principles of observation, composition, shading and mark-making. Each session focuses on a specific strategy and includes demonstration, practice and individual and group critique. Homework is encouraged. Please check the DAC website for supply list. © Figure Drawing (Ages 16 & up)

This class combines practice and personal expression with instruction and critique. Students sketch from a live, nude model in short poses (a few seconds to a few minutes) and long poses (up to 30 minutes). Lessons focus on specific skills: process, gesture, shading, mark-making, proportion, anatomy and composition. Each lesson begins with examples, demos and group instruction and includes guided practice, individual and group critique. For homework, students study and copy the master drawings provided. Basic drawing skills are needed for this course. Please check the DAC website for supply

Intermediate and Advanced Life Drawing (Ages 16 & up)

This is an intermediate and advanced life drawing course designed for those who already have had a life drawing course previously or other extensive drawing experience. It can be repeated for more in depth study. The class assumes prior experience and understanding of gesture and contour drawing, extended gesture, tonal modeling, and proportion. After reviewing briefly we'll build on these techniques to develop a range of visual and rendering skills including anatomical studies, detailed form studies, and enhanced compositional strategies. All while exploring your own personal and expressive visual language. Techniques will focus primarily on using charcoal, Conté crayons, and ink while opening up the end of the course to other water based and drawing media. Weekly critiques will mark your progression as we discuss ways the figure carries meaning through expression, technique, or scale. We'll look at historical and contemporary works for both understanding and inspiration. Leonardo da Vince said 'The supreme misfortune is when theory outstrips performance' so all of these elements will build progressively with the development of your rendering skills as the primary focus. ® Beginning through Advanced Watercolor and the Figure (Ages 16 & up)


This course concentrates on rendering the figure with watercolor, pen and ink. It is an all levels course presuming no previous watercolor experience but it is recommended that the student have had some life drawing courses previously. It can be repeated for more in depth study. We will develop color studies, and various techniques for rendering. Watercolor and ink have a long and varied tradition in drawing the figure, from the Renaissance with pen and wash to the expressionists and photo realists of our modern and contemporary time. The process asks one to slow down, to plan ahead and think in terms of painterly form but can also be applied quickly with expression. Less a life drawing and anatomy class and more a painterly exploration of the figure, we'll use some traditional techniques such as gesture and contour for under drawing. Building from the ground up with methods particular to watercolor including wet on wet and dry brush, we'll concentrate on exercises to enhance technique and provide a base for using this medium well beyond the course. We'll do advanced studies in color mixing and simultaneous contrast as well as a variety of rendering techniques from the painterly to pictorial. © Portrait Painting from a Photograph (Ages 16 & up)

This portrait painting class is a unique opportunity for students of all levels to learn the process of painting the portrait with oil paints (though acrylics are fine also) using a full palette. The course will center on the experience of painting from a photo reference. Students will learn how to achieve a better likeness as well as how to paint convincing flesh tones. Each class will include a painting demonstration, discussion and individual instruction. Discussions and handouts will cover the stages to developing a painting, anatomical proportion, structure of the face and features, as well as value, edges and modeling with color temperature. The beginner will learn fundamental principles such as how to mix colors and render form. Learn technical and practical aspects to distilling the complexities of a scene into a unified painting. We will consider some Master landscape paintings as well as contemporary masters and discuss what makes for a successful landscape painting. We'll get acquainted with the painter's tools and techniques through class demos and work on studies of our own. © Intermediate to Advanced Landscape Painting in Oils: Larger Paintings from Smaller Studies

Explore the process of painting a finished landscape from preliminary studies. This course will focus on selecting strong reference to develop a dynamic composition and working up a series of preliminary studies to serve as the roadmap for a larger finished painting. In the planning of our large painting we will resolve the challenges of composition, color and value with smaller studies. Prior to this course, students are strongly encouraged to first take Introduction to landscape painting or have prior experience painting in oils. 

Walk-in registration is between 9:30 am and 5:30 pm, Monday–Friday in the Education Office, located on the main floor in the Durham Arts Council building. **Phone-in registration** is accepted with a VISA or Mastercard between 9:30 am and 5:30 pm Monday–Friday. Call 919-560-2726. (Not available for camps.)

Register early! Many courses fill quickly so we urge you to register early. Enrollment is guaranteed only by payment of your course fee and space availability. Only registered students are permitted in class. You must be registered in a class in order to attend a class.

Confirmations: We do **NOT** send confirmations for these courses. Unless notified by the Education Office, students who have registered should assume that their course will meet as scheduled.

Virtual Class Policies

Virtual online classes through the Durham Arts Council will take place on Zoom. There is no cost to download and utilize the Zoom software. Class registration fees vary by class and continue to be accepted via our ProClass online registration. For more information about Zoom please see the "How to Participate in a Zoom Class" document found on the DAC website. Virtual class enrollment will follow the same refund/withdrawal policies as regular classes. Refund/withdrawal policies can be found on the Durham Arts Council website. Links to attend virtual classes will only be shared with registered students/families, instructors and staff members and for privacy reasons should not be shared with any other individuals. While attending a virtual class or camp we ask that students' names be displayed on Zoom (first name, last initial).

Payment Plans

Installment Plans for Classes — Automatic installments of two equal credit card payments are available on the registration form. Installments are not available for I-day workshops or courses costing less than \$100. The first payment is due upon registration and the second payment is charged to your account 5 days prior to the first class meeting. A credit card must be used for multiple payments.

Installment Plans for Camps — Automatic installments of two equal credit card payments are available for camps. The first payment is due upon registration & the second is due two weeks before your child's first camp session. A credit card must be used for multiple payments. We will automatically charge your second payment two weeks before the first session.

Payment Plans for Individual Music:

- Payment Plan A: Semester Tuition may be paid in full at the time of registration, prior to the first lesson. DAC can accept payment by cash, check, money order or credit card (Visa or Mastercard). Students who prepay tuition in full will receive a \$12.00 discount on each semester's tuition.
- Payment Plan B: This plan requires a 50% first installment of the full tuition for the semester prior to the first lesson, and then the tuition balance is automatically charged at the half way mark of your lessons to your credit or debit card. There is no fee for this service and you must have a credit card on file with DAC.
